



2009 Sangiovese

Background

Sangiovese was pioneered in Australia by Coriole Vineyards with the first plantings in 1985. It provided a contrasting style to Shiraz, the great tradition of McLaren Vale. It has proved to be ideally suited to the warm maritime climate of the region.

The fruit is sourced from some of the oldest producing Sangiovese vines in Australia. The 2009 vintage is Coriole's 23rd release.

Tasting Notes

Aromas of perfumed red fruits, cherry and lolly musk. With more air raspberry and vanilla bean emerge.

The palate is medium bodied with bright red fruit and fresh berries. Hints of spice and cardamom follow. The finish is long with fine, even tannin and lengthy acidity.
