


MCLAREN VALE



The soils on the Coriole estate vineyard are predominantly terra rossa soils.

These soils are shallow, with red-brown earth over hard capped limestone.

Coriole also manages small vineyards in the sub-regions of Blewitt Springs, Willunga and McLaren Flat giving us a range of different terroir to work with.

*It was always believed that the shiraz vineyard used to produce the Lloyd Reserve Shiraz was planted in 1919. However, new evidence suggests the vines may have been planted earlier, with newspaper records indicating that vines existed on this location in 1875.

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
